

From an Employee

Monica Peterson, HSWC Animal Health Specialist

"Monica" has written this article. My name hasn't changed. It was written by my daughter, a.k.a. "Little Monica" or "Monica P." She wanted to share from her perspective and I thought it would be a nice change of pace!

Just a little bit about myself: My love and compassion for animals runs very deep. I grew up in the animal shelter environment for a majority of my life and it's where my experience and knowledge of animal behaviors and medicine blossomed.

I've been with the Humane Society of Waupaca County since 2007. I started off as a cat cleaner, evolved to kennels and so on. Now here I am 14 years later as an Animal Health Specialist and creating this Newsletter.

First I'd like to mention - this is not an easy job... My wonderful co-workers and I do not get to spend 4-10 hours just playing with cute little kittens or snuggling up with our favorite dog. I won't say we don't take a few minutes out of our day to do it often, but it's

not our entire job as some would like to think. We spend a lot of time cleaning, feeding, medicating, evaluating, nursing sick animals back to health, bottle feeding, finding the right pet for adopters, following up with adopters, working with volunteers...and the list could go on forever. We work very hard to keep adoptions flowing and everyone healthy, including ourselves.

Second - this job is emotional.. We've all cried here, there's absolutely no denying that. We've all experienced happy tears from an animal we attached to when they finally find their forever home. We've all experienced sad tears when an animal we tried so hard to help, can no longer be helped. We've all experienced frustrated tears when we feel like our job is endless and then somehow there's still more to do. We spend hours with all the animals from the time they enter the facility until the time they leave. We're emotionally invested in over 100 living creatures at a time that are solely dependent on us for almost everything.

Third - this job is incredibly rewarding. Again, we've all experienced happy tears when an animal who was on the brink of death, survived the hour, night, day, week (and so on) OR when a cat we thought would be feral turns out to be loving after hours or weeks of being worked with by dedicated staff and volunteers. The most rewarding thing is to see these animals leave the building with a forever family, knowing we did our job, knowing we saved a life. Knowing this trumps the difficult, emotional job we have.

This isn't an easy job because we put all ourselves into it creating the most loving environment we can for scared animals that are confused on why they ended up "at the pound." It can take hours, days, weeks and months before we see the true nature of some of these pets shine through.

From an Employee

My most recent experience with this was performing an intake exam on cats that came in as strays and were terrified. I let them sit for a day thinking that they would calm down and would be easier to handle the next day. Two of the three were totally fine. Purring while I was digging gobs of ear mites out of their ears. Then kitty number three, his name is Bacio now, we got him into the exam room, obviously terrified, but not trying to bite. He got loose and he destroyed the room. Knocking stuff off counters, shelves and walls. Trying his hardest to escape. Escape us, escape his fear and confusion, just trying to escape everything. He didn't understand we were there to help him.

After I was able to get him wrapped into a blanket we quickly treated his ears, vaccinated him and calmly put him away. Thank goodness I had help. We were concerned Bacio would not come around quickly with daily attention. Thank our "lucky kitties", we were very wrong. It took him two days to be a wonderful, loving, purring little machine. He purred just at the sight of his favorite people and it made all our hearts smile when we heard that motor going.

quickly, but sadly that's not the case for some. It's emotional because happily, we were proven wrong and saw Bacio make a complete 180 degree turn around in just a few days. Knowing that we can now handle Bacio without any worry about him harming himself, staff, volunteers or other cats creates an overwhelming amount of emotion that's incredibly hard to explain. It's rewarding because we helped this terrified kitty feel better and trust us, gave him and his siblings a safe and warm place to stay, and now he'll get to experience what it means to feel love. We did that and we can't wait to find Bacio and his siblings a forever loving home.

I love my job, but it's definitely not a walk in the park, as much as I wish it were; but it's taught me so much about myself, about people, about animals, and again.. this list is never ending. I didn't write this article to show how difficult this job can be, but to educate on what our job is here. Because here we are caregivers, feeders, trainers, mothers, siblings, and so on. We are whatever these animals need us to be for as long as they need us to be it. We wish we could save them all and we sure try to save as many animals as we can. To the animals we can save...it's their entire world, their second chance for happiness, safety, never going hungry and most of all Love.





Brin figured out there's a big window behind this chair and he's been bird watching all morning




Walker and Mavis are bonding and getting along very well! Thank you again for trusting us with these 2 incredible pups! They are bringing such joy to our house!

10 things you may not know about cats

1. The Nose Tells All.

Nose-to-nose greetings between strange cats don't happen, as it puts both in a vulnerable position. However, cats who know each other but have been apart for a while feel safe enough to do this to confirm visual recognition and gain information about where he has been and what he has been doing.



2. Purring means...

Purring usually indicates contentment, however, a deep purr can also indicate pain or stress. If you know your cat well you will be able to tell the difference in his demeanor

3. Cats Prefer Baby Talk

Cats appear to retain their kitten vocal signals to communicate with their owners, but they use an adult repertoire of sound with other cats.

4. Cats and Lilies Don't Mix

The flower, the leaf and the bulb of ALL lilies are toxic to the cats kidneys. Watch those inexpensive fresh floral bouquets, they almost all contain lilies.

5. Cat Naps

Cats like to nap rather than sleep but if relaxed enough to enter a deeper sleep, they produce the same brain wave patterns that we do when we dream.

6. Cats Don't See Eye to Eye

Cats blink and narrow their eyes when they accidentally make eye contact. Eye contact can actually be quite threatening to any animal. To make friends with an unfamiliar cat, blink and look away when you catch his eyes.

7. Cats require Positive Reinforcement for Good Behavior

Cats cannot understand punishment as humans do, they must be praised and rewarded for desired behaviour instead. Consistency is the key.

8. Cats Can Clean Their Teeth with Meat

Giving your cat a strip of raw meat everyday to chew on will help keep his gums and teeth in good condition. Suitable meats include poultry, rabbit, or beef that has been deboned. This is how cats in the wild maintain healthy teeth and gums.

9. Kittens learn litter habits from Mom

Kittens as early as 3-4 weeks of age develop litter substrate preferences depending on what is available in their environment, and also by watching to see what their mother prefers to use.

10. Cats Purring Remains a Mystery

Scientists do not know exactly how the purring sound is made, although some believe that it originates in the cardiovascular system rather than the throat.

The idea for this list, and some of the information I did take from the **Reader's Digest.com** website -but I modified several of the items, and made some of the facts a little bit more accurate.


